

Across cultures and centuries, dragons have taken many forms: feared monsters, wise guardians, and powerful symbols of nature. By connecting global dragon legends to real animals, past and present, this exhibition reveals how observation, imagination, and cultural storytelling transformed reptiles, fossils, and unfamiliar species into the legendary creatures we know today.



Themes

Through live animals and scientific interpretation, visitors discover that many “dragon traits”—scales, flight, venom, immense size, even fire-like abilities—have parallels in the natural world. At the same time, the exhibition highlights how humans attempt to explain the unknown. By comparing myth and biology, visitors develop a deeper appreciation for both scientific inquiry and storytelling as ways of understanding the world and are encouraged to ask, “How do we turn what we don’t understand into stories—and what can science reveal about them?”

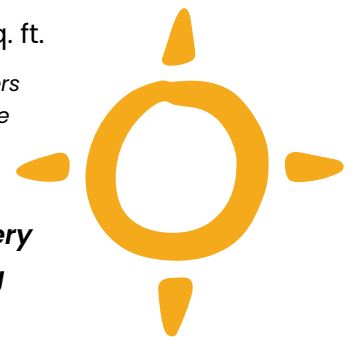
