

When you walk into Survival of the Slowest, you enter the world of counterintuitive adaptations, where your thoughts about animal characteristics and their impact on survival may be challenged. In the natural world where environments change and pressures vary, one creature's best is another's weakness.



Themes

Through the star of this exhibition, the Sloth, visitors will learn that no single trait defines success in nature, only how well an organism fits its environment. We reframe classic ideas of "survival of the fittest" by showing how fitness is context-dependent, animal characteristics come with costs and benefits, and success in nature is about balance, not extremes.

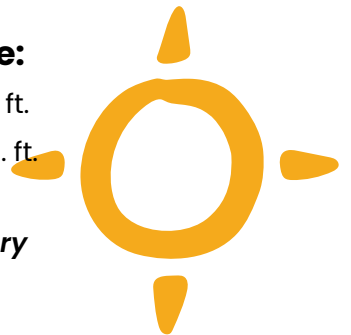
